A CHALLENGE FOR 2010: TO VIEW LIFE FROM THE VANTAGE POINT OF ETERNITY

Dear Friends in Our Lord Jesus:

We live in a world of instant gratification. A “Cookie Monster” world, if you will — named after the Sesame Street character whose main focus in life was summed up this way: “Me see cookie. Me want cookie. Me get cookie.”

As much as we might desire it, God rarely responds to us when we act that way. Our perspective on life is extremely narrow, limited to the immediate range of our senses and our fading memories. But God sees us through the flawless lens of eternity and encourages us to look at ourselves from that perspective as well.

God challenges us to view each moment as a gift — a gift that points us beyond our immediate circumstances toward our place in His never-ending Kingdom.

What this means, in other words, is that the most obvious choice is not the best choice. Nor is the easiest choice always the proper choice. God works in much more mysterious and creative ways to make His will known to us. And He is constantly at work in our lives — and in the lives of those around us — to guide us and direct us.

All we have to do is pay attention to Him.

As a case in point, take the wonderful story of the city of Leipzig, Germany. This beautiful city has an unrivaled reputation for musical, artistic, and academic excellence.

It is the birthplace of Richard Wagner (1813-1883), a remarkable innovator both in musical harmony and dramatic presentation.

It is the village that educated Wolfgang von Goethe (1749-1832), poet, dramatist, novelist, and scientist. And also Robert Schumann (1810-1856), a brilliant pianist and composer who overcame a strange weakness in a finger of one hand.

Leipzig is also the place where the great reformer Martin Luther debated the Christian faith with Johann Eck in the 16th Century. It is also the site of the artistic direction of the brilliant composer and conductor Felix Mendelssohn (1809-1847).

And nearly 390 years ago, in 1723, the city suddenly found itself without a trained organist and choirmaster — a position that was central to the town’s life and worship.

The first choice was the esteemed musical scholar Georg Telemann (1681-1767). At that time, Telemann was the most famous composer of his generation. He was serving as director of music for the five central churches in Hamburg.

But Telemann rejected the offer to move to Leipzig.

And so the second person on the list was contacted, Christoph Graupner (1683-1760), who was also considered a musical genius. He had already served for three years as harpsichordist for the Hamburg opera and had served the royal family since 1709.

But Graupner could not arrange a release from his duties in Hamburg, so he also rejected the offer.

Reluctantly, and with great hesitation, the town authorities approached the third person on the list. They were resigned to the obvious fact that they were settling for “third best.” And their lack of excitement was quite apparent. So, in May of 1723, the “third best” candidate for the job was unenthusiastically called into service.

His name was Johann Sebastian Bach.

Nearly four centuries ago, Bach began to serve the village of Leipzig as Kantor of the St. Thomas Church and organist at the four Lutheran churches in town. His title was civic director of music.

For the next 27 years, until his death in 1750, Bach served the churches in Leipzig. While there, he wrote “The Passion of St. Matthew” and “The Passion of St. John,” as well as his glorious “Mass in B Minor.” He also composed five full cycles of cantatas — in which a single cycle contains 60 cantatas (one for each Sunday of the liturgical year plus special feast days).

Sunday worship in Leipzig during Bach's tenure lasted three hours — from 7 to 10 a.m. The liturgy began with the reading of the Gospel, followed by one of Bach's cantatas, which was played in its entirety. The sermon, the creed, the prayers, and communion would follow.

Each Sunday, Bach conducted a choir of 16 voices and an orchestra of 18 instruments. St. Thomas Church was always filled beyond capacity.

From the abundance of His mercy, God provided Leipzig with the music of eternity. From His treasure-house of love, God showered Leipzig with the voices of angels.

And it all came through choice number three.

Immediate gratification did not work in the spiritual realm four centuries ago in Leipzig, and it falls short today. God desires so much more for us, and He invites us during this New Year to share in His joy.

Our service times will be at 7 a.m. (in the chapel), 12 noon (in the chapel), and 7 p.m. (in the nave). All three services of Holy Communion will offer the imposition of ashes. (There will be no 5:30 p.m. service in the chapel that evening.)

HOPING TO GROW SPIRITUALLY IN 2010?

Several people have asked me about ways to grow spiritually during the New Year . . . And I have shared with them this list of proven ways to improve spiritual health — a list I emphasize in every Confirmation Class and Bible study. Each suggestion is predicated on the guarantee given to us by the Lord Jesus Himself: "Ask, and you will receive. Seek, and you will find. Knock, and the door will be opened to you. For everyone who asks, receives. Everyone who seeks, finds. And the door is opened to everyone who knocks" (Matthew 7:7-8).

Here are some suggestions for spiritual growth for 2010:

1. Read the Bible every day. Begin with a prayer for the Holy Spirit to make the words come alive in your mind and heart. (Start with Matthew's Gospel and try to read a chapter a day.)
2. Pray every day. Find a quiet place and time (at the beginning of the day) and go humbly before the Lord. Spend time listening silently as well as talking, and pray mostly for others and not exclusively for yourself. Choose each morning to BE a Christian in thought, word, and deed.
3. Attend worship services faithfully. No one is a Christian in isolation. We are part of the Lord's family and we need each other. (Our ancient enemy does his best work against those who separate themselves from the community of faith.)
4. Receive Holy Communion often. The Lord continues to nourish us with His precious Body and Blood — His spiritual food, strengthening our spirits for the challenges and trials of life.
5. Pay close attention to the Lord's presence in our lives, in the lives of those around us, and in the beauty and wonder of His creation. God leaves His "fingerprints," as it were, all over our world.
6. Reach out often to those less fortunate than we are. Jesus promised us (Matthew 25) that when we minister to the "least" of His children, we are ministering directly to Him.
7. Be aware at each moment, in every situation that arises, that we are walking in the Light of Christ. Look for the angels that God sends into our lives each day.
8. Read each day from the Daily Office in the Book of Common Prayer (Morning Prayer, Noonday Prayer, Evening Prayer, Compline), and follow the lessons in the Lectionary at the back of the Prayer Book.
9. Attend a Bible study, class, spiritual growth group, or support group on a regular basis. Our faith is strengthened when we share it with others.
10. Learn to practice "random acts of kindness" every day. By doing so, we learn to become "beacons of light" in a world that is mostly interested in darkness.

COMING SOON TO THE CATHEDRAL: CAT SCAN



During the first two months of 2010, Gethsemane Cathedral will be taking a congregation-wide CAT scan involving all our members. The “Church Assessment Tool” — or CAT scan — is a survey of members to determine the spiritual health, strengths, weaknesses, distinctive qualities, and potential areas of growth for the future.

Specifically, the CAT scan will provide questions that look at seven core areas: Hospitality, morale, governance, conflict management, spiritual vitality, readiness for ministry, and engagement in education. Designed by a national consulting firm in Columbus, Ohio (Holy Cow! Consulting), the CAT scan has been used by Episcopal churches throughout the country over the 25 years.

Specific areas that are measured are: Key indicators; drivers of satisfaction, attendance and giving; future goals; strengths and work areas; descriptive indices; performance indices; financial information; and leadership indices.

The survey will be available on-line, primarily, but hard copies will be sent to those who do not have access to the Internet. The Cathedral Chapter will be designing some of our own questions to be included in the survey.

Bishop Michael Smith and Dr. Sandy Holbrook of St. Stephen’s in Fargo have been trained in administering the survey and will be available to help us as consultants.

Much more information will be available in the coming weeks, as we prepare mailing lists and e-mail lists of our community. We hope to begin administering the survey as soon as possible, following an initial three-week time for publicity and instructions.

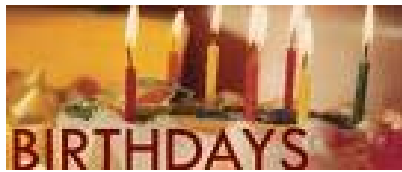
FIVE NOMINEES IN PLACE FOR ANNUAL MEETING ELECTION FOR CHAPTER
